Special Programs

Adventure Camps. Campers 13 and over can kayak, hike, canoe, bike, rock climb, or learn basic camping skills. Options vary from staying at Calumet and going on day trips to overnight experiences, and some contain both. All adventures are guided by certified and experienced leaders.

Special Needs campers are invited to join the resident camp program during **July 1-7 and/or July 8-14**. This is a fully integrated, mainstream experience limited to 15 special needs children, ages 8-21 or still attending high school. Campers must care for themselves with limited assistance.

Drama Camp is one of the options for campers **July 1-7**.

Children's Stage Adventures with Rob and Lorrie Gray present a new musical adaptation of Shakespeare's beloved comedy *A Midsummer Night's Dream*. When four friends run away from their problems at home, they end up in an even bigger mess in an enchanted forest inhabited by fairies, spirits, and magic flowers. Friday night performance.



Music Camp is a fun singing experience option **August 12-18** under the expert direction of Dave Piper, assisted by Jane Roets. This is a wonderful experience for both children's choir veterans and someone trying it for the first time. If you play an instrument, bring it along to join in the concert's rousing finale. The repertoire is lots of fun, upbeat, and varied.

- ◎ Calumet is a residential camp for girls and boys ages 8-18.
- ◎ For 52 summers, excited campers have arrived at Calumet to find experienced and well-trained counselors waiting for them. Most were campers themselves. Many are certified in CPR, First Aid, and Red Cross lifeguarding. All of them love kids!
- ◎ There are two counselors in every cabin or platform tent of 6-10 campers. All cabins and tents have bunk beds and electricity.
- ◎ *Spiritlife* is the curriculum theme for 2012.
- ◎ Bus transportation is provided from Newington, CT, Vernon, CT, Worcester, MA, and Waltham, MA. You can sign up for the bus when you complete the Summer Camp Packet.
- ◎ Karl Ogren, executive director, makes sure that the staff is well trained, that camp's facilities are in excellent condition, and that all campers are safe, have lots of fun, and make new friends.
- ◎ Calumet is operated on behalf of the congregations of the New England Synod of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America (ELCA). Admission is on a first-come, first-served basis, and will be provided regardless of race, sex, color, national origin, or religion.
